Welcome to our Fall 2024 Guidebook!

We have a lot of things to be happy about in the Library as we make the transition from Summer into Fall. One of the new things that we're very excited about is the July installation of Bozeman's first "1% for Art" piece. "Confetti Cloud," by Livingston artist Jessica Kay Bodner, is a colorful hanging sculpture that now hangs from the ceiling over the first floor's east reading area.


The "1% for Art" project was adopted by Former Bozeman Mayor Cyndy Andrus and the City Commission in November 2020. The program requires 1% of the construction costs to be set aside for some City capital projects for installations of City-owned public art. The program applies to projects involving new City buildings or expansions and renovations of existing buildings that have construction costs over \$500,000. Our recent renovation project allowed us to be the first participant in the program.

Late September will bring our first "Children's Storytelling Festival." This innovative event will inspire children to create and tell their own stories in a variety of ways. For more information, please watch our website.
